Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 1.6%** since 2019, falling by 110. Population is expected to **increase by 2.8%** between 2024 and 2029, adding 193.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **increased by 19.3%** in Kingman County, KS from 2,688 to **3,207**. This change **outpaced the national growth rate of 4.4% by 14.9%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate increased from 63.1% to 77.7% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **17.5% of Kingman County, KS residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (4.0% below the national average), and **11.6% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.7% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Other Specialty Trade Contractors, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

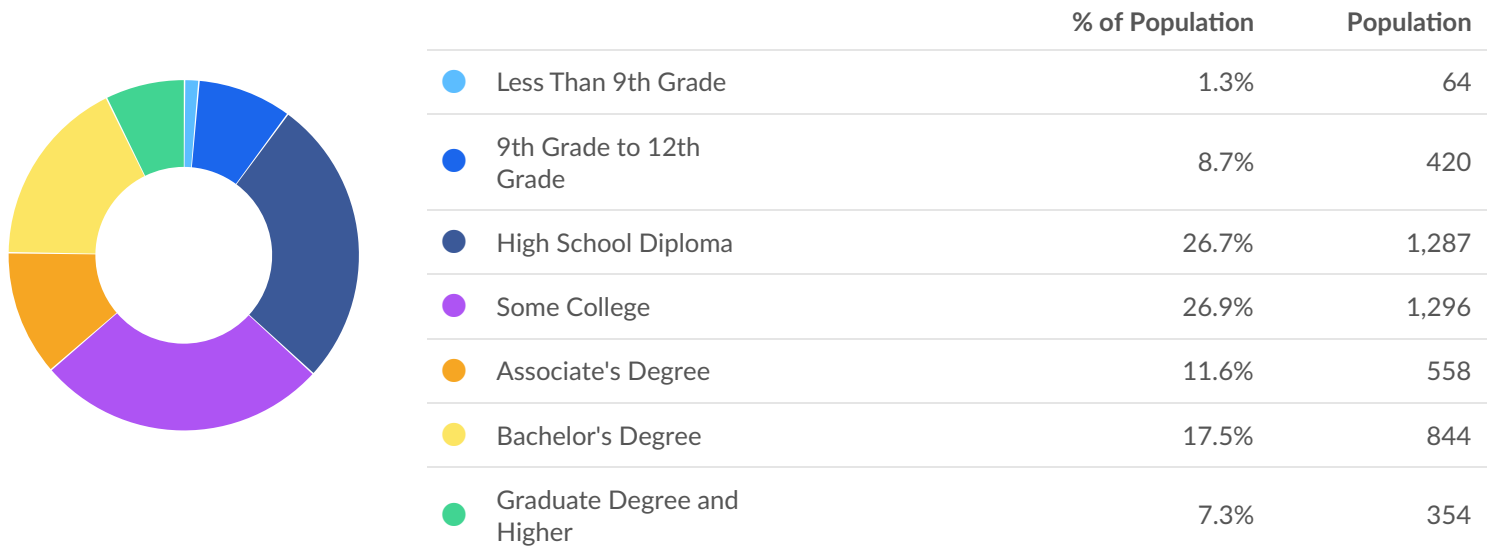

Sep 2025 Labor Force Breakdown



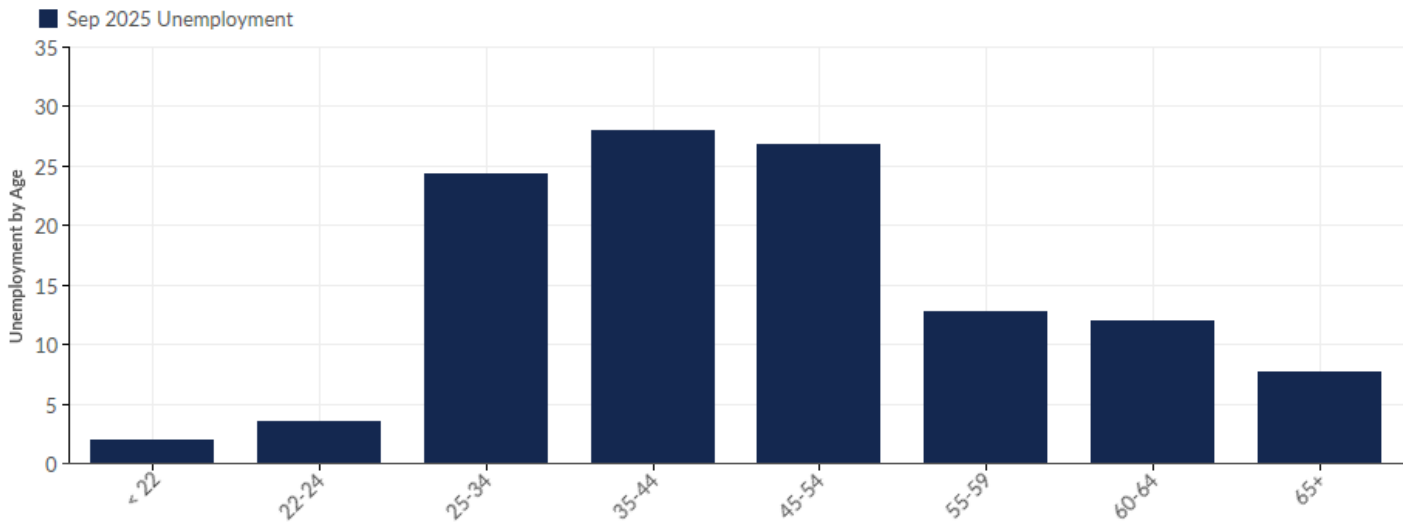
Educational Attainment

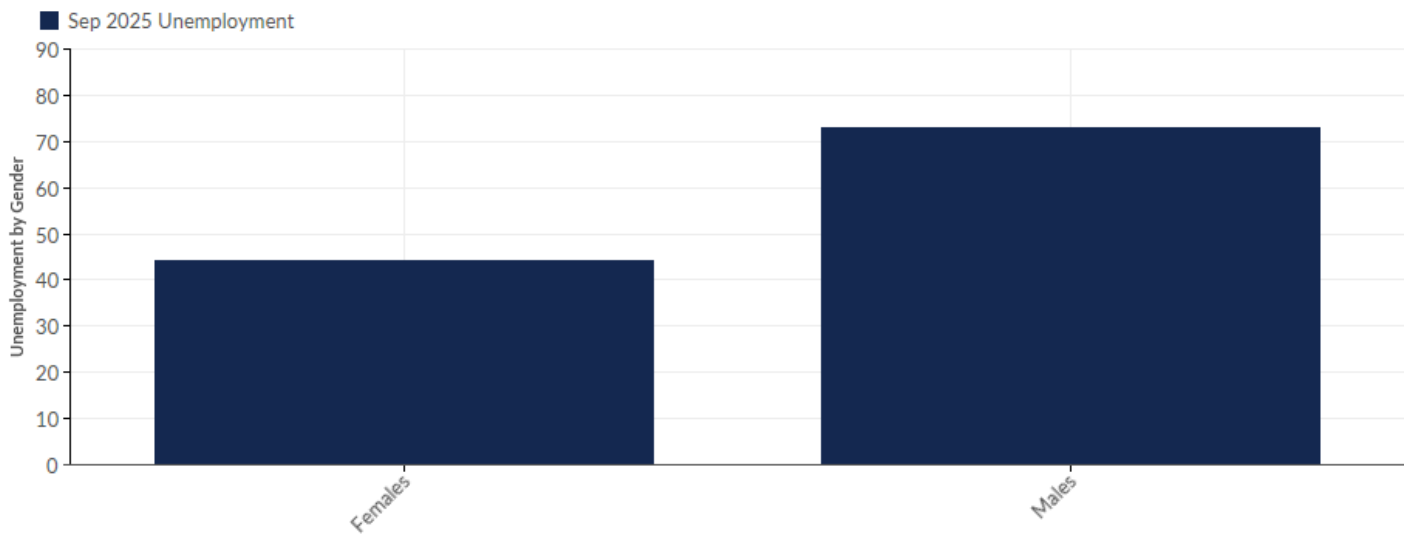

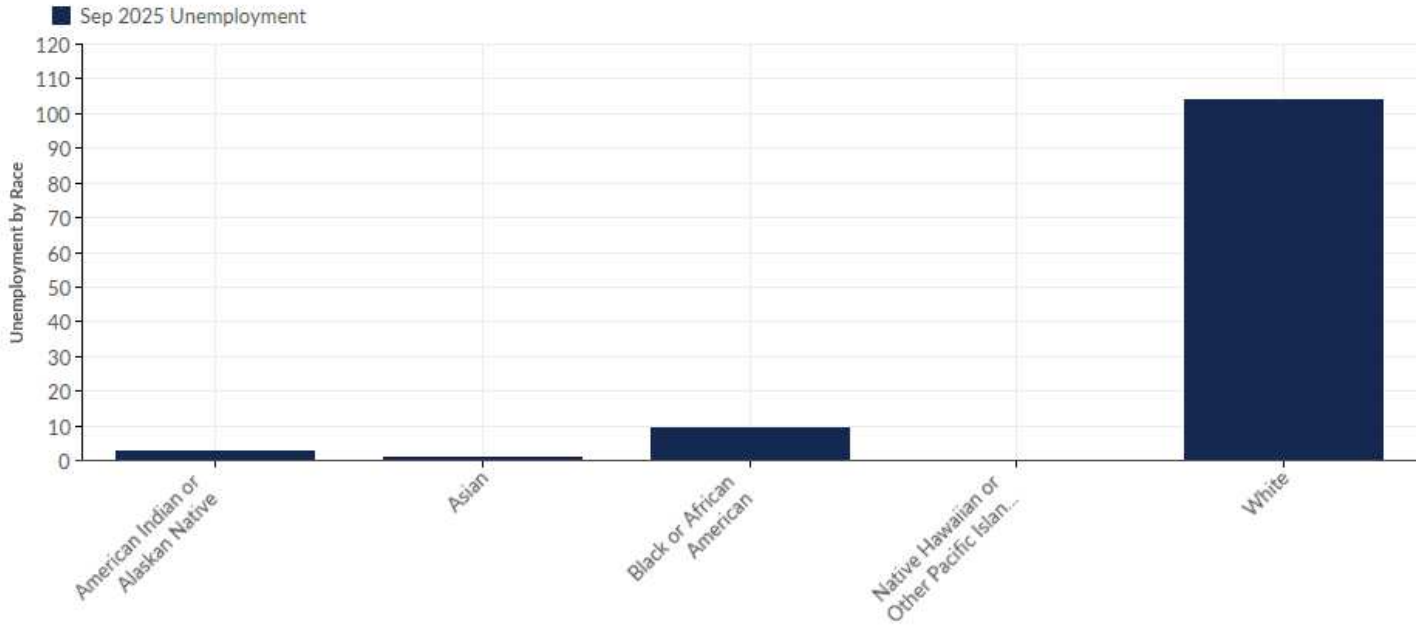

Unemployment by Gender



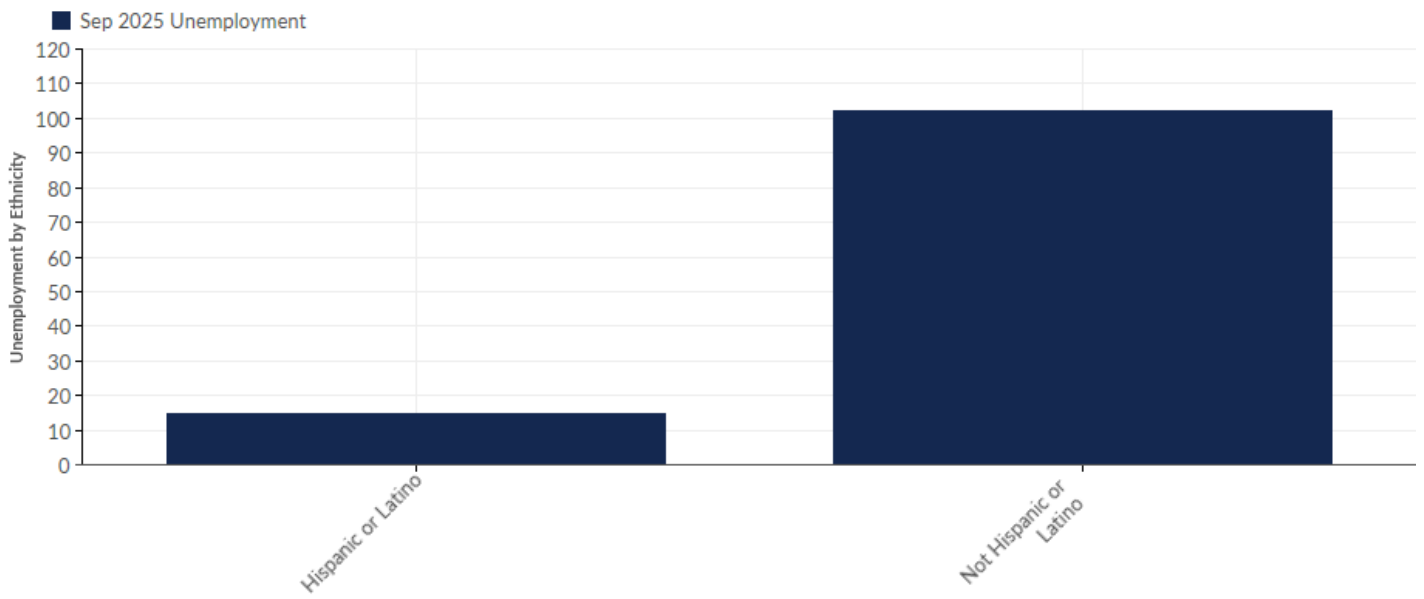

Unemployment by Ethnicity

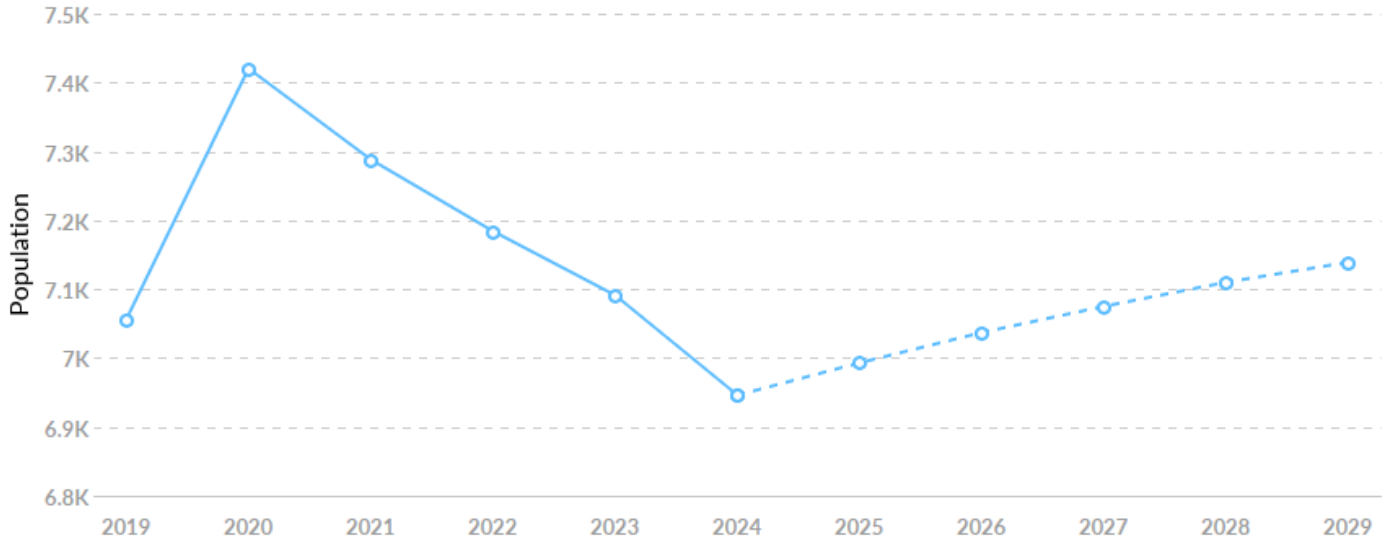

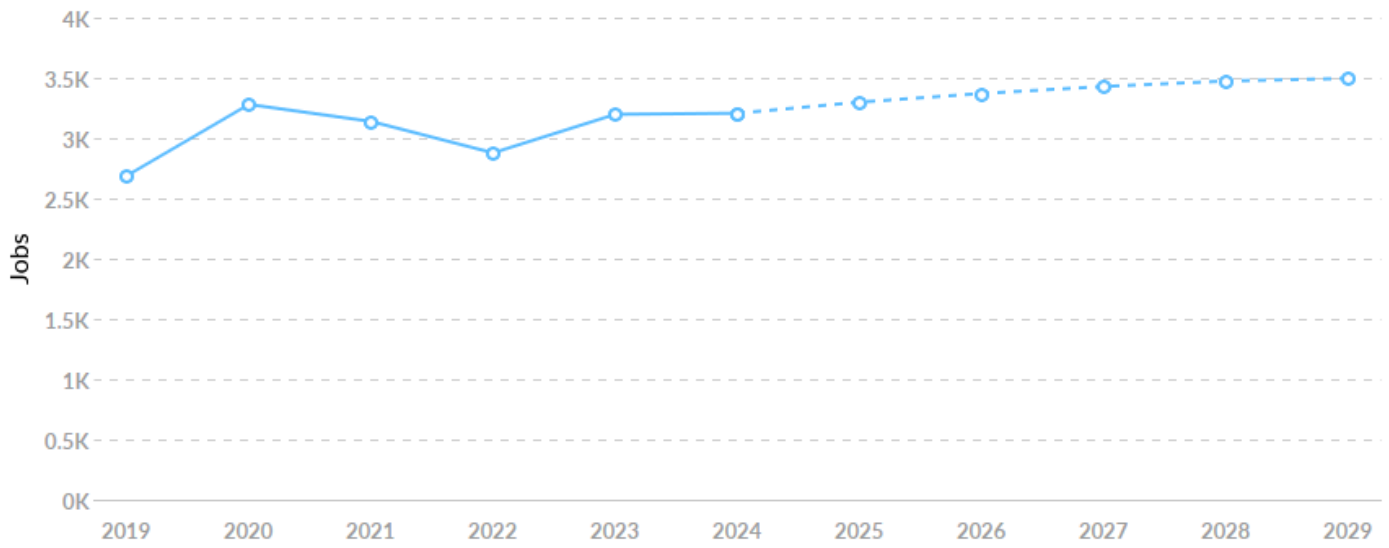

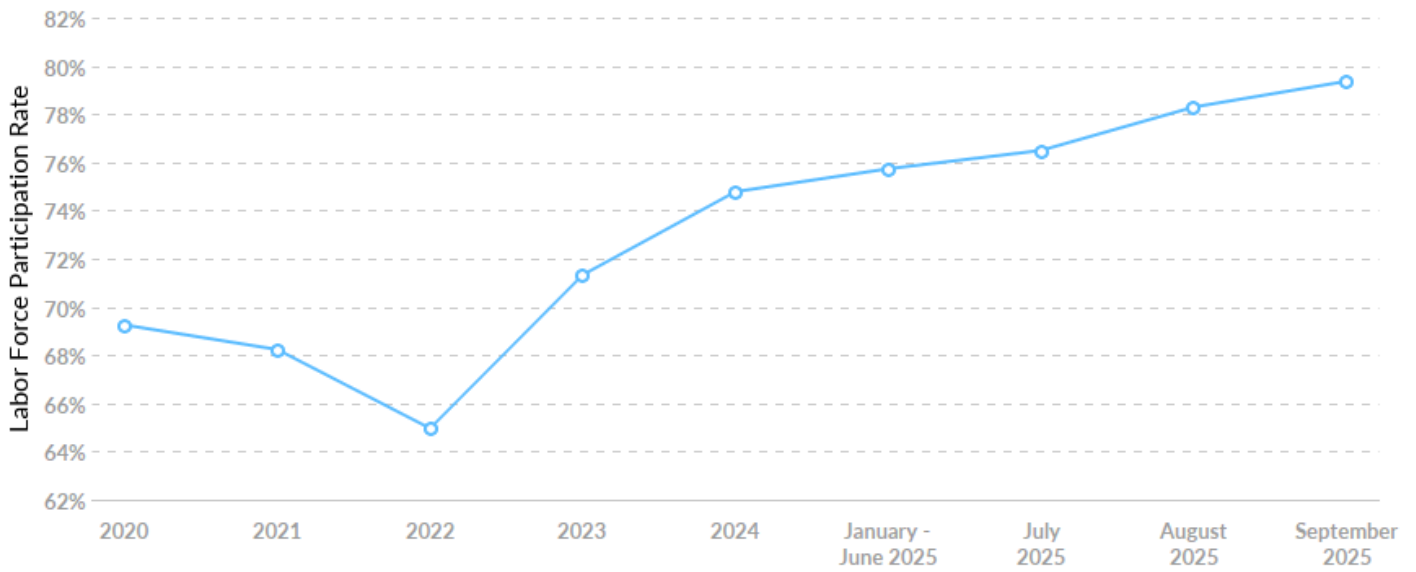
Job Trends

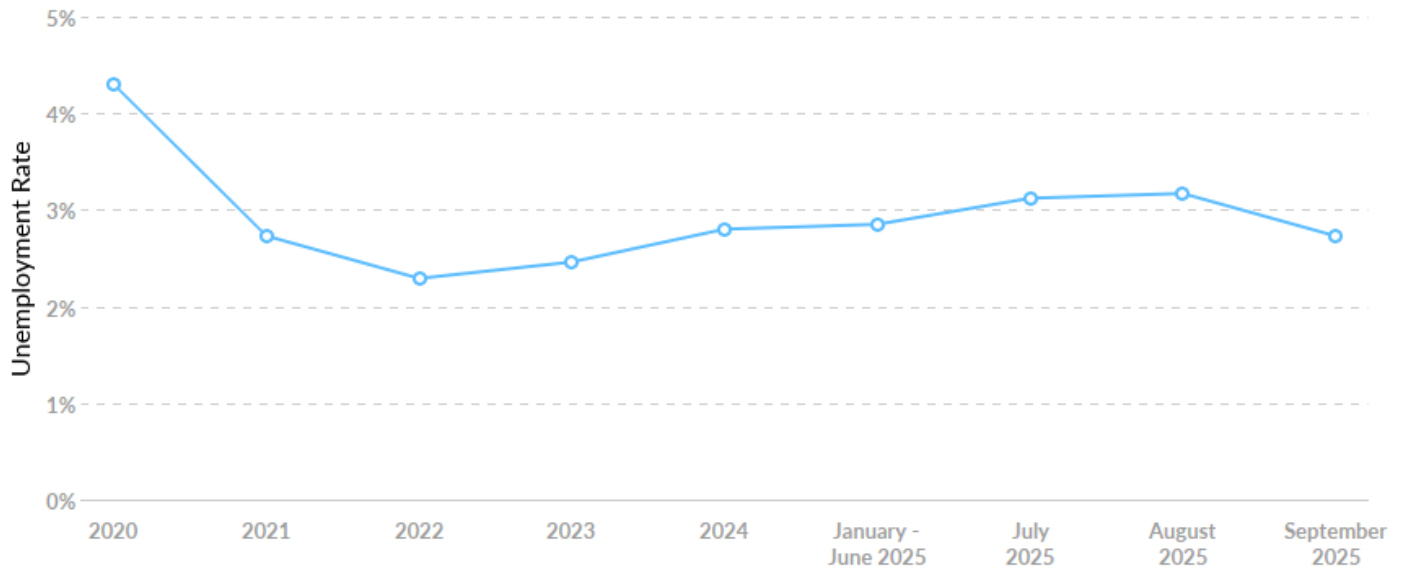

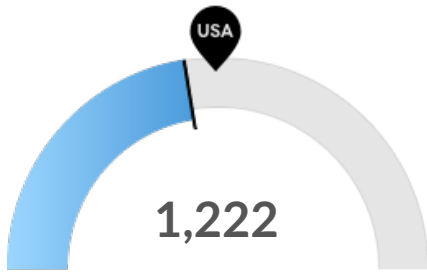
Unemployment Rate Trends

Kingman County, KS had a September 2025 unemployment rate of 2.73%, **decreasing from 4.30%** 5 years before.



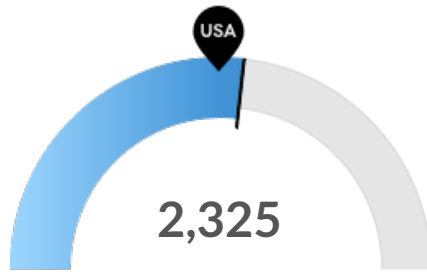

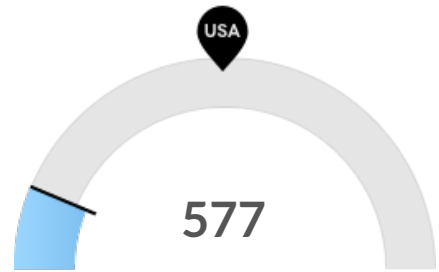
Millennials

Kingman County, KS has 1,222 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 1,422.



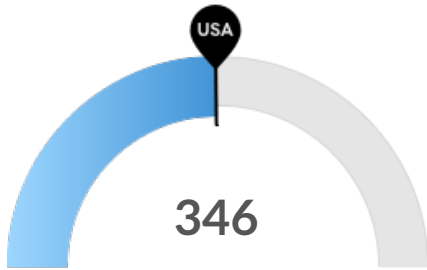
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Kingman County, KS. The national average for an area this size is 2,100 people 55 or older, while there are 2,325 here.



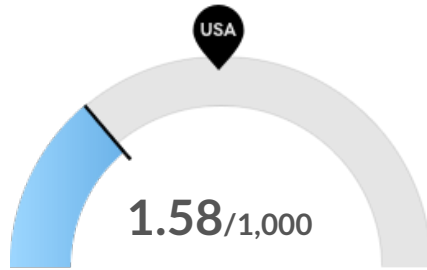
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Kingman County, KS. The national average for an area this size is 2,955 racially diverse people, while there are 577 here.



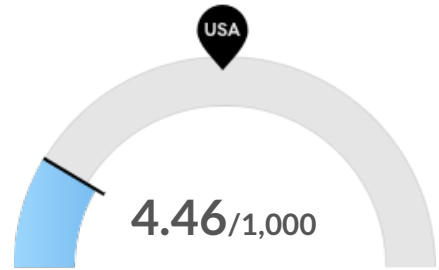
Veterans

Kingman County, KS has 1.58 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.38 per 1,000 people.

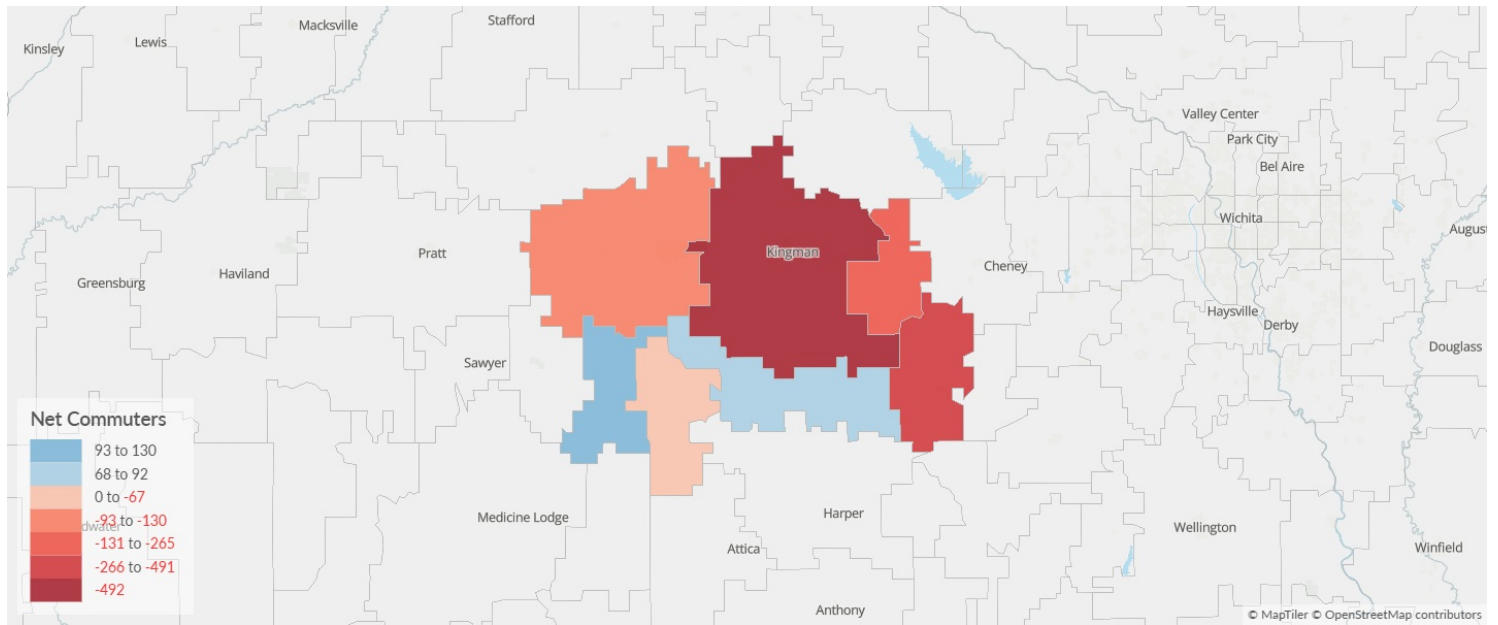


Property Crime

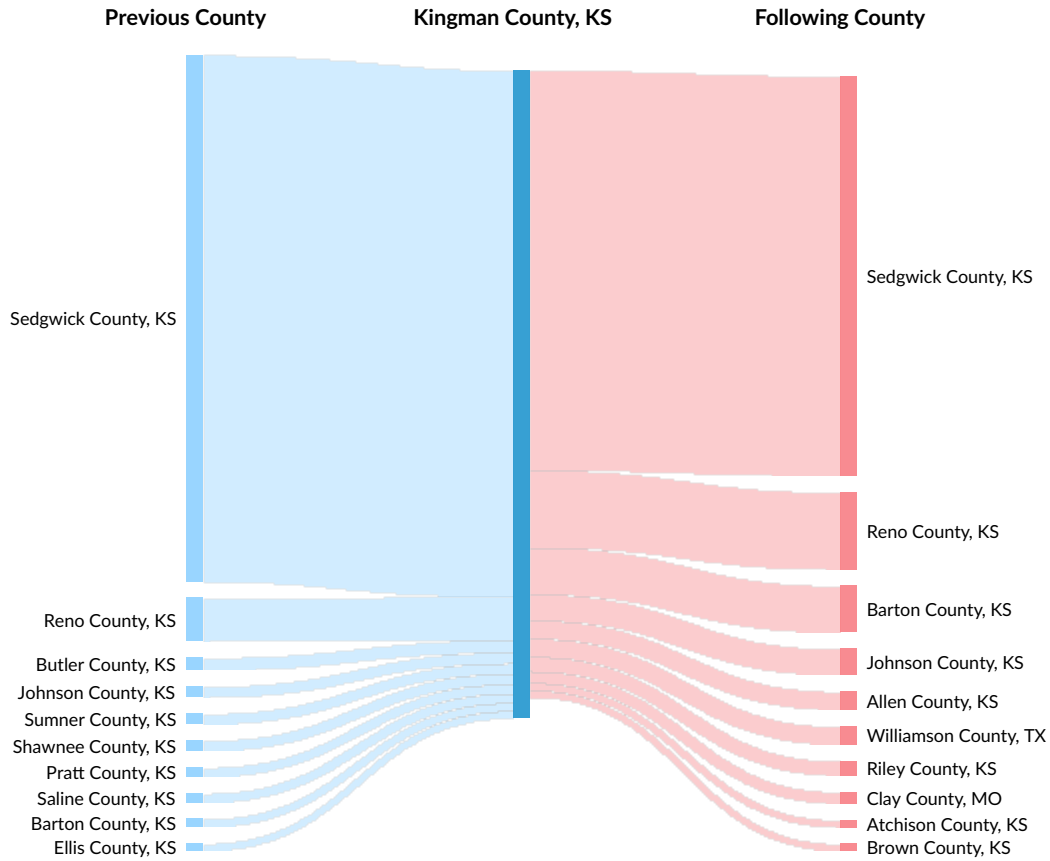

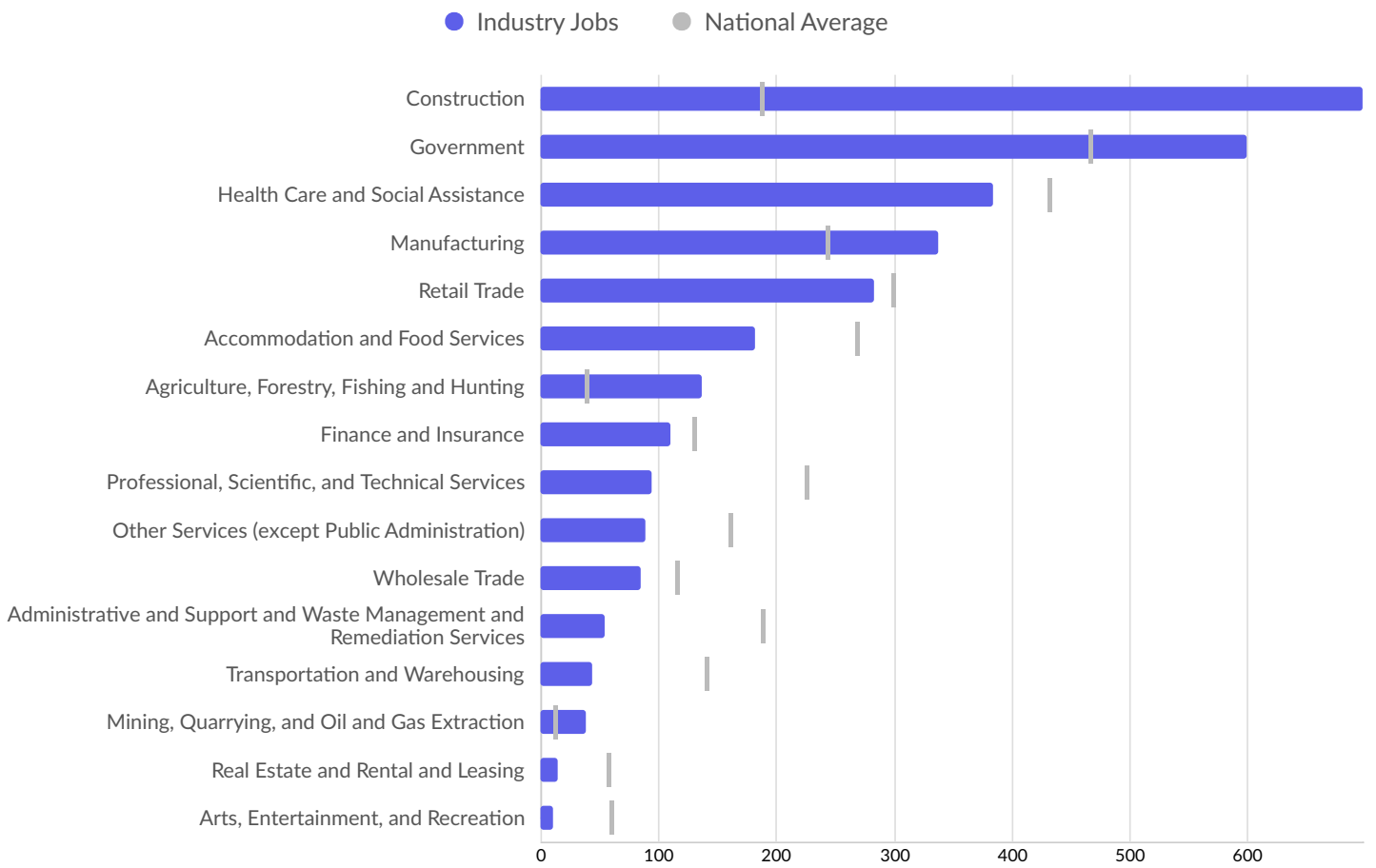

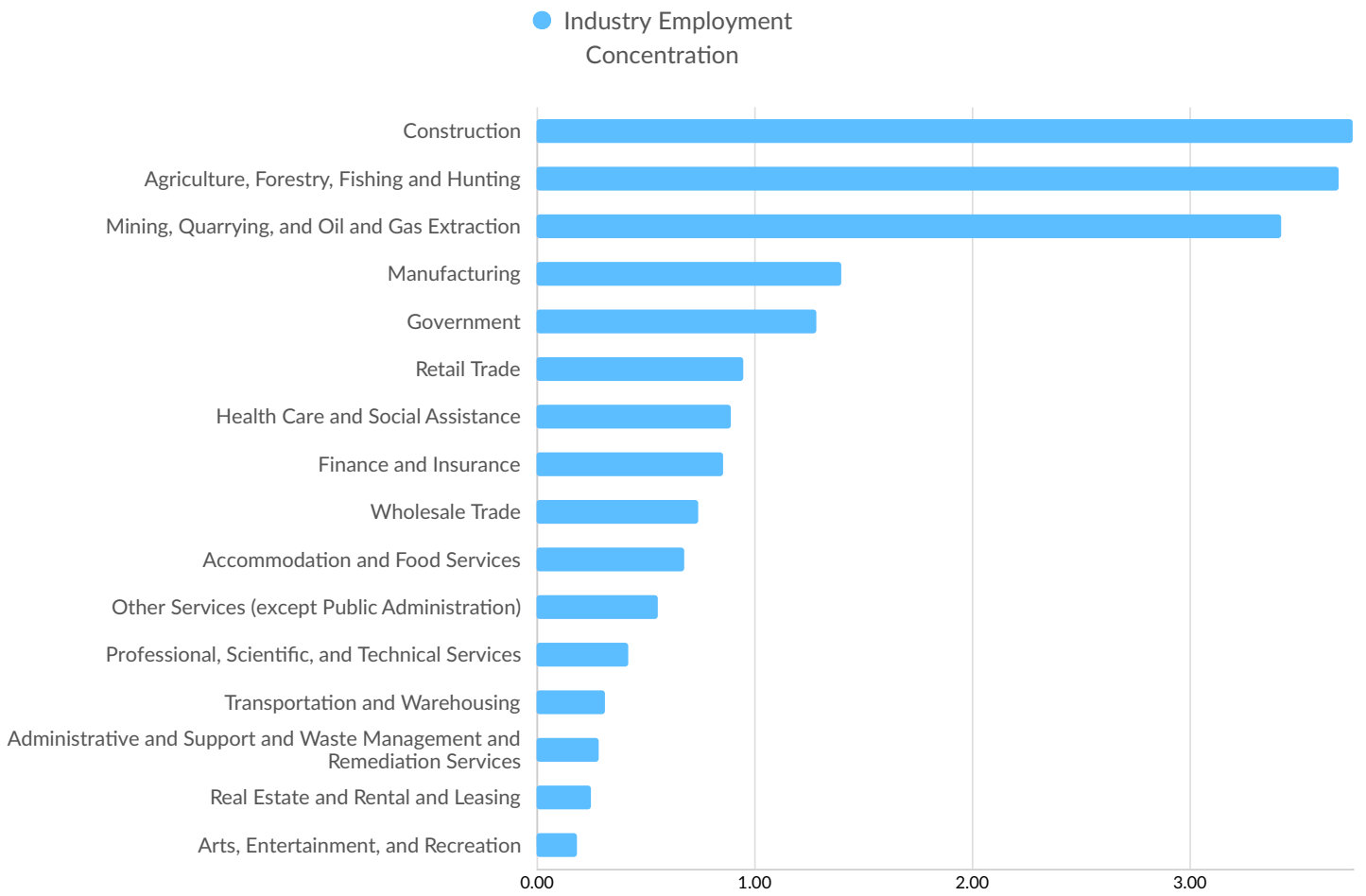

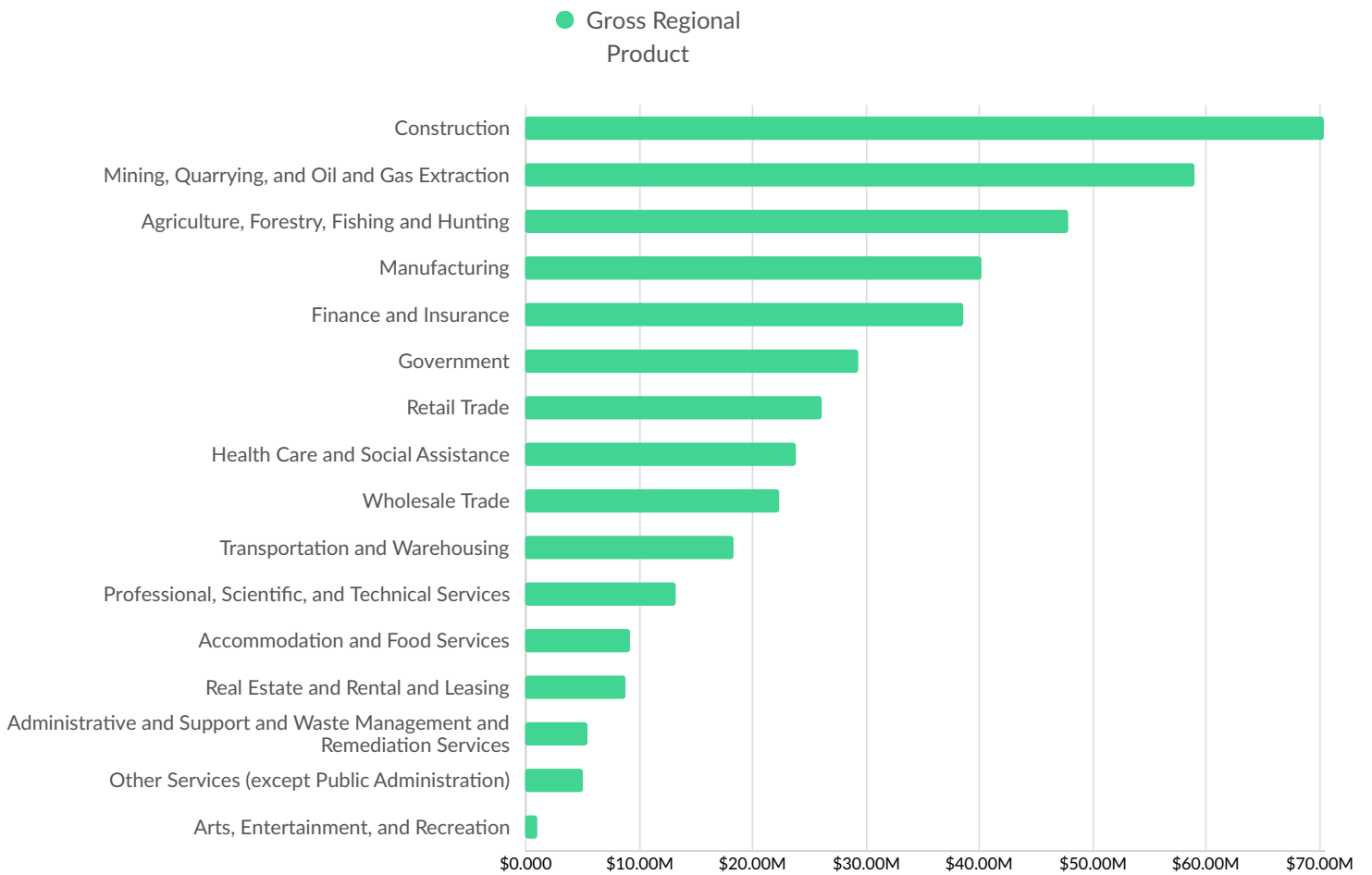
Top Growing Industries



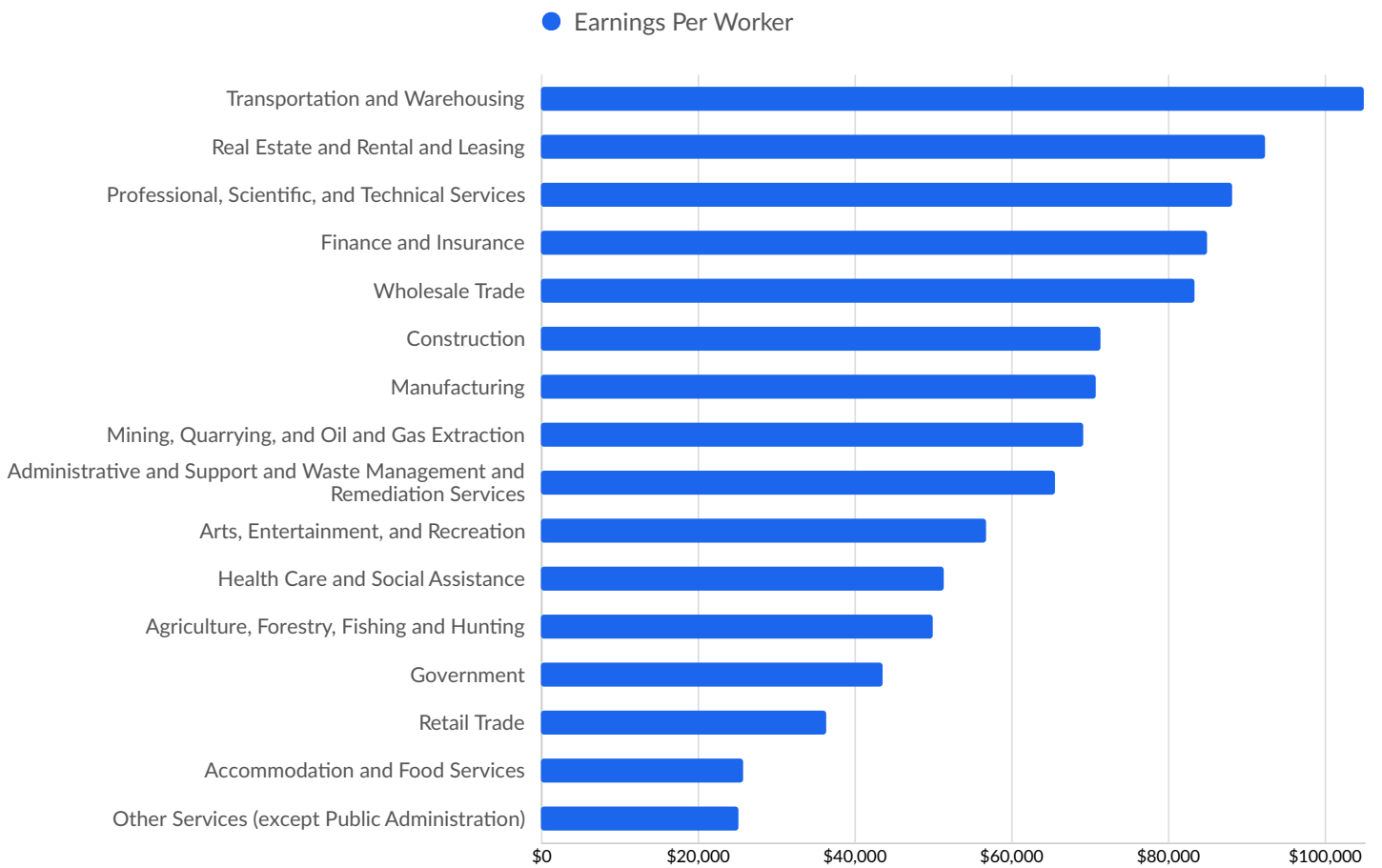
Top Industry Employment Concentration

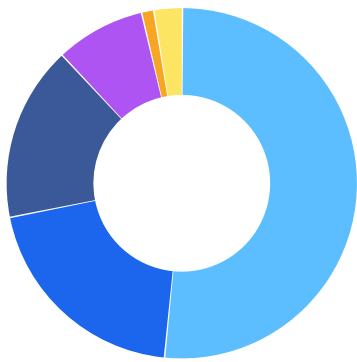

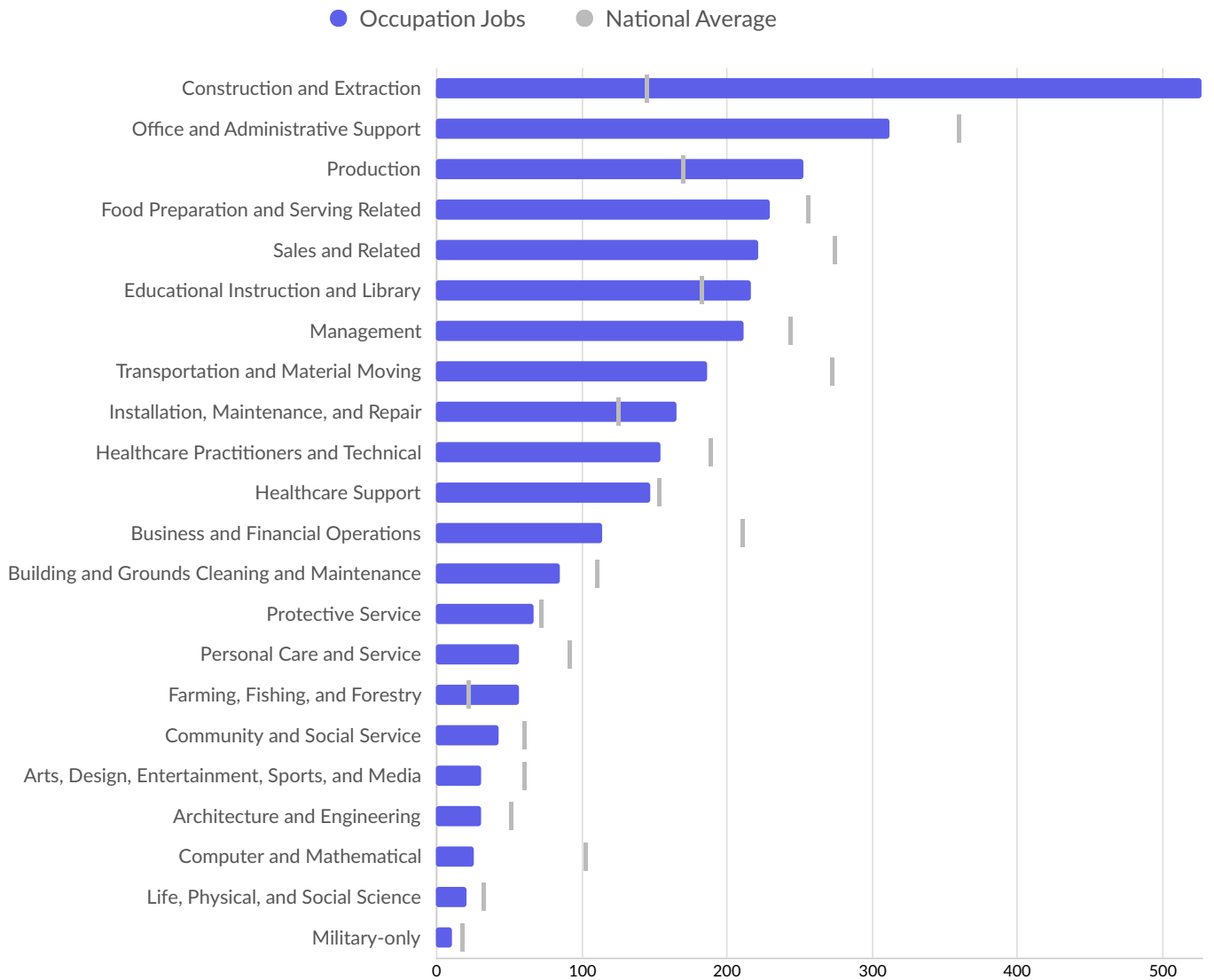

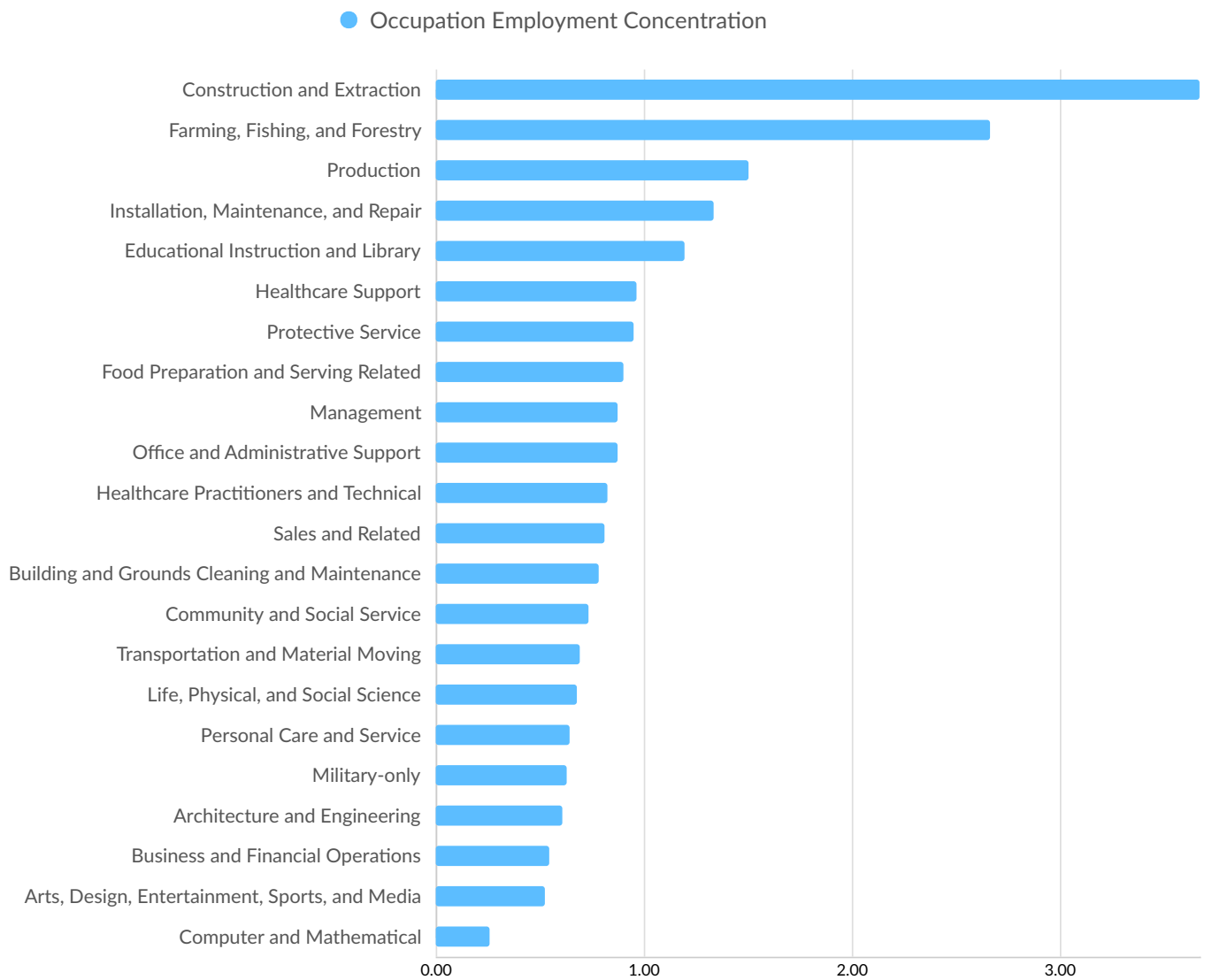

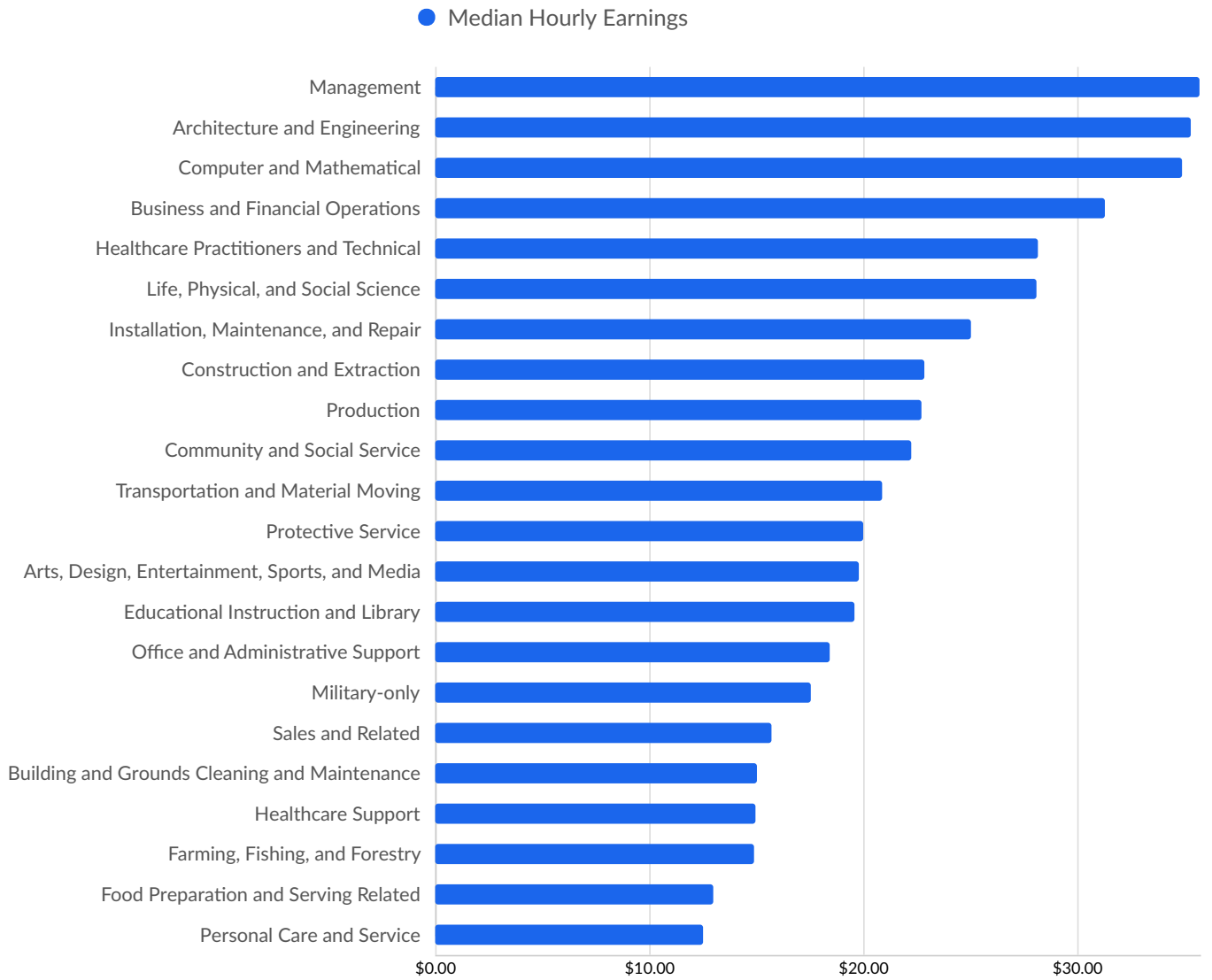
Top Growing Occupations



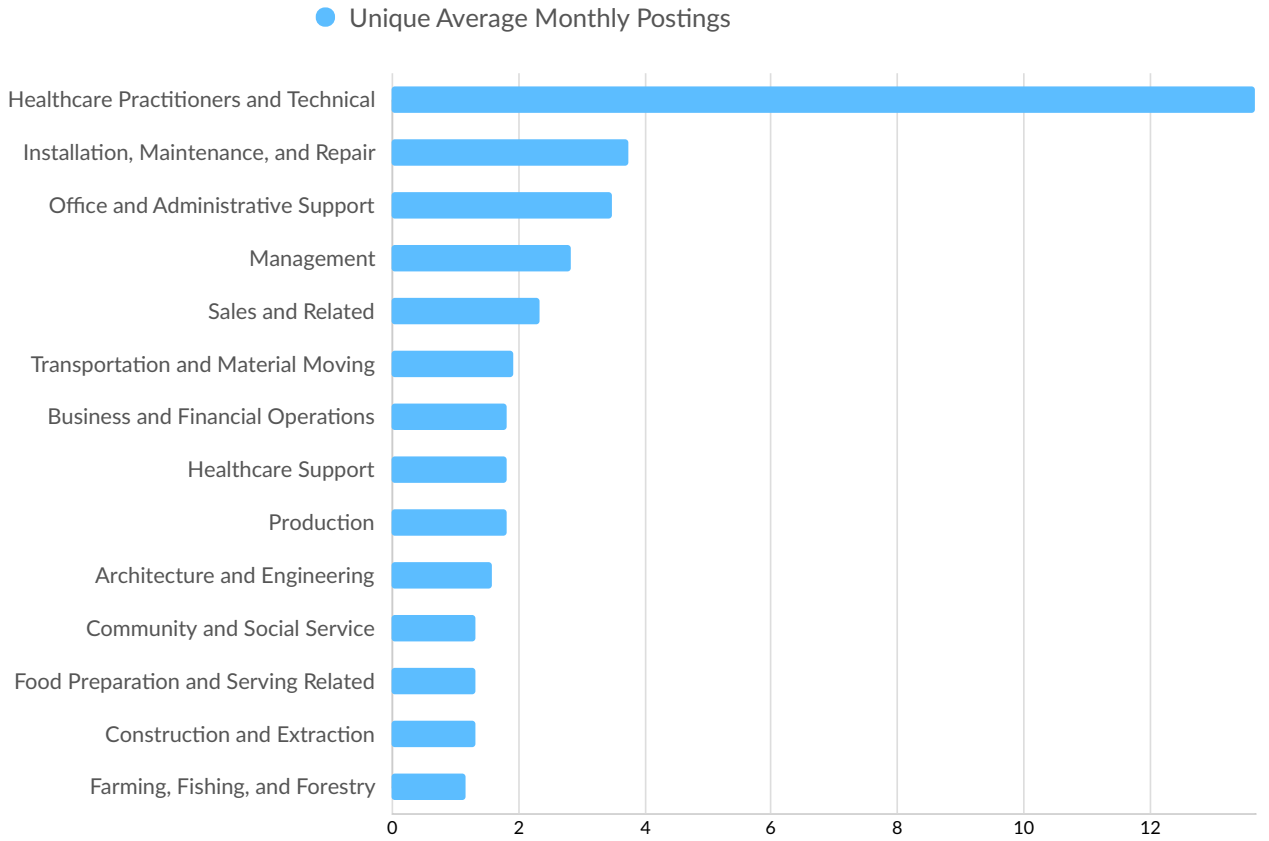
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



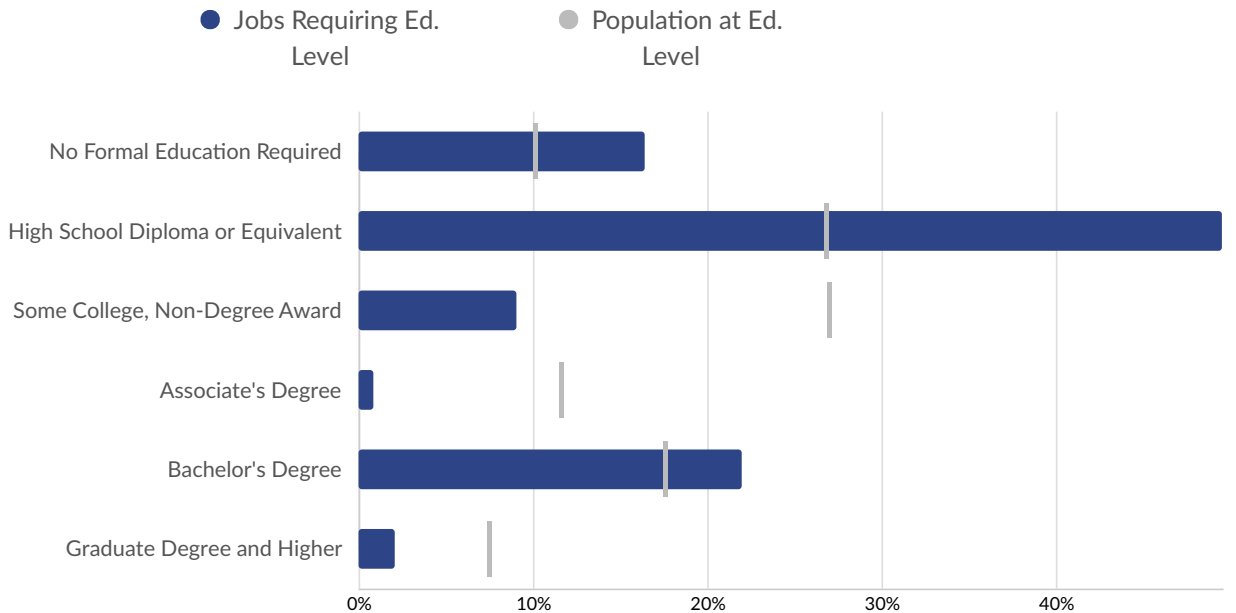
